- Council authorized the Mayor to sign Inland Cellular lease agreement to construct a cell tower near water tank to provide cell service.
- Listened to presentation from Laurie Marin from Progressive Engineering detailing alternatives/options for upgrading/increasing water sources.
- Proposed address changes to portions of South Front (500 block and 100 block) and South/North Main (100 block) – letter sent for comment.
