APRIL COUNCIL ACTION

- Kip Jenkins was present to get approval project extending chain link fence around tennis court a little higher.
- Tera Stoner discussed the progress of the Horizons project and some of its action items – web-site and expanded newsletter. On an unrelated matter, Tera reported concern for speed above Monica Street in the Hammond Addition. Council will get bids for speed bumps.
- Diane and Lyle Branting requested 6th street (between Main and alley) blocked off during evening hours of Old Timers Day on July 21st.
- Updated presentation from Laurie Marin of Progressive Engineering detailing water study update. Council will request RFP for test holes and well. Michelle Bly indicated that information for income survey was ready.
- Council authorized the Mayor's signature on safe routes grant application.
- Discussed the continued maintenance obligation of mowing the small park area at the post office – decided to discontinue at end of this season.
