## MAY COUNCIL ACTION

- Pat Eck (Horizons project leader) gave an overview of the project and requested the City act as the fiscal agent to receive/disburse funds.
- Tera Stoner reported the progress of the Horizons project: an expanded/new web-site will be developed and the newsletter will be expanded both in information provided and in the distribution area.
- Speed bump issue has been resolved for the time being – no bumps, but additional signs, more patrol, and tickets issued for speed over posted limit.
- Approved Tavern owner's request to block Main Street immediately after parade for beer garden and street dance on Old Timers Day on July 21<sup>st</sup>.
- Michelle Bly (Progressive Engr.) indicated the initial income survey did not meet the requirements, but is allowed to select a second random survey to double check results – if you are selected, please fill out the information.
- Council approved bid from Poe Asphalt and authorized street repairs on Scott Street and several patch areas along with Eagle alley improvement.
- Approved the renumbering of several house numbers on Front/Main Street.
