

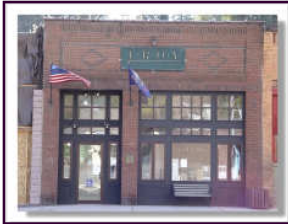

Things to remember about the City's snow plowing

- ◆ Cars and trucks have to be off the street for them to be able to plow your street.

- ◆ If snow is banked up and blocking mail delivery, then it is your responsibility to clear it for the postal carrier to deliver.

### Troy Recreation District

The patrons of Troy voted to form a Recreation District that provides opportunities and funds for recreation projects within its boundaries. A map of the district is posted at the Troy School District Bus Garage and at Troy City Hall. The types of projects that can be funded need to follow guidelines established under Idaho Code, title 31, chapter 43. A copy of the code can be found from a link on the Troy Recreation District Web Site at [www.TroyRecDistrict.com](http://www.TroyRecDistrict.com).

Grants are awarded twice a year. The first cycle of grants are due by the 25<sup>th</sup> of December and the second cycle are due by the 25<sup>th</sup> of April. Grant applications are available in small amounts (\$1,500.00 and large amounts (\$1,500-\$7,500.00). Applications can be found at the web site, City Hall or Sterling Savings Bank.
