REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

CITY COUNCIL MEETING: 5:00 p.m.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: Mayor, Steve Corr called the meeting to order at 5:00 P.M.

MINUTES: Bill Abbott moved and Mike Yenney seconded to approve the minutes from the meeting on May 27, 2020 and the Special Meeting on June 2, 2020. Motion passed.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE: A motion was made by Cindy Gray and it was seconded by Mike Yenney that the city pays the bills presented for June 2020. Motion passed.

MAINTENANCE REPORT: A written report was submitted by the Maintenance department. Danny was also present to report on the water system upgrades. Including updating the telemetry system and installing a touch read or radio read system in the city.

FOREST MANAGEMENT REPORT: No Report

POLICE REPORT: Attorney Susan Wilson gave the council a draft of the proposed agreement for overnight parking at the back of the city park. The council will take the document home and review it for discussion and action at a later date.

AGENDA:

- **Reconsideration**—Trevor Drollette was present to request reconsideration from the city regarding the vacation of 5th Street to allow for him to keep the structure that he has built in the city right of way. Patrick Cordova spoke against the council reversing their previous decision on the matter. Bill Abbott stated that it was his duty to look out for the best interest of all residents in the City of Troy and he could not justify the vacation as in the best interest of all. It was moved by Mike Yenney and seconded by Cindy Gray to deny the request for reconsideration of the decision not to vacate 5th Street. Motion passed. The time frame for removal of the structure was tabled until a later date. The city will research what other agencies do in similar situations if a structure is to be removed.
- **Water System Project**—it was moved by Cindy Gray and seconded by Bill Abbott to upgrade the telemetry system for the water system as part of our ongoing water improvement project. She moved to accept the bid from KMI for \$7500 for the upgrades. Motion passed.
- **Wastewater Treatment Facility**—the mayor reported briefly on the prices of the removal of the sludge from the wastewater treatment facility. No action was taken
- **6th Street Bridge**—no discussion.
- **Executive Session**—no executive session was held
- **Executive Session Action**—no action was taken.
