REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

CITY COUNCIL MEETING: 5:00 p.m.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: Mayor, Ken Whitney, Jr. called the meeting to order at 5:00 P.M.

MINUTES: Steve Corr moved and Bill Abbott seconded to approve the minutes as corrected from the meeting on July 10, 2019. Motion passed.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE: A motion was made by Bill Abbott and it was seconded by Paul Groseclose that the city pays the bills presented for July 2019. Motion passed.

MAINTENANCE REPORT: It was moved by Bill Abbott and seconded by Paul Groseclose to approve the purchase of a chop saw for the maintenance department with a maximum budget of \$1500. Motion passed.

FOREST MANAGEMENT REPORT: Ken presented the sheet with the latest prices from Bennett for our timber.

POLICE REPORT: Sheriff Richie Skiles was present. He felt that the Troy Day event on July 13th went very well with no big incidents. Sheriff reported that he is going to be assigning a liaison to the City of Troy to have as a central point of contact. Sheriff also asked the city if they would like to participate in the National Night Out event that is held in Potlatch each year. In the past the city has donated money to purchase bikes to be given away at the event. The bikes are labeled as being donated by the City of Troy. It was moved by Bill Abbott and seconded by Paul Groseclose for the city to donate \$227 to purchase bikes for the National Night Out on August 6, 2019. Motion passed.

AGENDA:

- **Greg Mann**—the city accountant was present and presented a draft of the FY2020 budget for the council to take home to review. The council did not take action regarding an increase or change in the elected officials salaries. It was moved by Steve Corr and seconded by Bill Abbott to approve the draft FY2020 budget for publication for the public hearing on August 14, 2019. Motion passed.
- **Street Name**—it was moved by Steve Corr and seconded by Bill Abbott to rescind his motion made on July 10, 2019 to name the streets Mountain View Street and Valley View Street. Motion passed. It was moved by Bill Abbott and seconded by Paul Groseclose to name the streets Mountain View Avenue and Valley View Drive to be consistent with the street signs that are already in place. Motion passed.
- **407 & 409 S. Pine Delinquent Bills**—the residents of 407 S. Pine were present to request forgiveness of some or all of the outstanding utility bill. The council did not agree to take that action. It was moved by Mike Yenney and seconded by Steve Corr that the city clerk was directed to proceed with the process of submitting the outstanding utility bills to the county for attachment to the property tax bill if not paid in full by July 25, 2019. Further, the council directed that the water services shall not be turned on to the properties until the bill is paid in full. Motion passed.
- **Street Closure**—it was moved by Paul Groseclose and seconded by Bill Abbott to approve the closure of 5th Street between Main Street and Swan Alley from 4:30-8:30 on Friday, August 30, 2019 for a vendor fair. Motion passed.
